Jerwood Arts gives money to artists and creative organisations so they can make art.



We have launched a new fund called the **Live Work Fund**.



This fund is to support people to create new live artwork like theatre, music, dance, or performance.

Jerwood Arts is an arts funder.



This means we give money to artists, performers, producers and creative organisations to make art.



We do this to help them get their ideas and projects off the ground.



We want to make sure people have access to art and get paid to be creative.

About the Live Work Fund



The coronavirus had badly effected people who make live artwork like theatre, music and performance.



This fund is to pay people **£20,000** to continue making live artwork over 2021.



You will also get help from the Jerwood Arts staff with your work.




We will support at least 33 people with this fund for 12 months.



It is free to apply.

What work will the fund support?

Some example activities the fund will support include:




Testing new ways of working.



Creating new networks like peer-learning or support.



Learning new skills.



Starting new relationships with audiences.

Who can apply



Freelance or independent creatives such as:

- ✓ Actors
- ✓ Choreographers
- ✓ Composers (for live performance)
- ✓ Designers (set, sound, lighting for the stage/live performance)
- ✓ Dancers
- ✓ Directors
- ✓ Facilitators
- ✓ Performers
- ✓ Producers
- ✓ Writers (for the stage/live performance)



People with experience of live art in the past **18 months**.



People with **no more than 10 years experience**.



People living in the **UK** and have the legal right to work in the UK until January 2022.

Who can't apply



Anyone who is in full-time or part-time **formal education** at any point between January 2021 and January 2022.



Proposals that include activity taking place **outside of the UK** in 2021.



Proposals which focus on visual art, literature or film making.



Applications mostly about:

- X Stage management
- X Technical management
- X Production management, promotion
- X Marketing
- X Fundraising
- X Admin

How to apply

At the beginning of the application form, you will find a 'Is this fund right for me?' quiz to help you decide if the fund is right for you.



The online application form also allows you to upload your answers as an audio or video recording.

You will need to invite 2 referees to support your application.



A referee is someone we can contact to find out more about your work and its potential.



Your referees will need to provide you with a 100-word statement in support of your application.



The deadline to apply is **10:00am** on **Monday 16th November**



All applicants will be told the outcome on the 10th December.
